<b>Funding rate</b>	A maximum of 75% of the approved total budget, with a reimbursable part and a non-reimbursable part up to 33%

**National/regional deadlines**

Applicants are encouraged to contact CDTI's National Contact Point for getting advice about national funding rules before submitting a proposal. Additionally to the international application process, all Spanish applicants that aim to received CDTI's funding (projects coordinators and partners) must submit a formal application (with the information related to National Eligibility check) by way of CDTI's electronic submission system. This information has to be submitted to CDTI no later than 10 days after the closing date for pre-proposals and full proposals, respectively.
